- 2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC
- 1. In order to enhance the quality of teaching and learning IQAC has directed the faculty members to arrange (like previous years) special classes for the academically backward students. Special coaching classes have been arranged for the meritorious students. All these classes are arranged after Test Examination of the students of each year. Seven smart classes have been introduced.

In this academic session (2016-2017) IQAC has arranged a general guardian meeting with the guardians of the students of the each Honours Department who have failed in their Pre-Final Part 1 Test Examination and as per their request supplementary examination was also held. Students, who were unable to secure 40% marks in supplementary test, are not sent up for their Final University Examination. And this decision has been taken along with the Teachers' Council, Students' Union and Guardian Forum.

To ensure the quality of teaching learning and evaluation IQAC also collects data from the ongoing students of each Honours Department and takes necessary steps based on their feedbacks. In every year feedback is also collected from the outgoing students.

2. In order to enhance Student Support Services IQAC has introduced mass SMS to the students conveying information regarding all sorts of academic activities like examination, deposition of fees, admit card and mark sheet distribution, dates of academic and carrier counselling etc.

- 3. In order to enhance Health awareness as well as Social Commitment IQAC has started Thalasemia Screening Camp for the students since last 4 years.
- 4. This year the **Student Support Wing of IQAC has organized** a special seminar on **Exam Fovea** keeping in view the anxiety and tension regarding examination prevailing among most of the students. The renowned Psychologist Dr. Shreemoyee Tarafder came to share her views with the students and in the interactive session students actively participate in the seminar. It has been decided that we would organize such seminar for the students of each academic session.
- 5. IQAC, in collaboration with Bengali Department, has organized a Seminar on **Legal Awareness** to create awareness among the student community to avail of the opportunities provided by the legal cell of the local judicial jurisdiction where they live. Session Judge of the Uluberia Court came to deliver his valuable speech in this regard and students were greatly benefitted.
- **6.** IQAC has also arranged a seminar on **Religious Tolerance and National Integrity** on 8th May, 2017 on the occasion of Tagore's birthday. Prof. Supriyo Bhattacharya of Kalyani University was the speaker on the above mentioned topic.
- 7. In order to serve students' interest IQAC has arranged seminars on Skill Development spheres like Computer Hardware, Modern Office, Communicative English etc. Classes have also been started on the above mentioned topics to promote skill development among the students for their future career.
- 8. Every year IQAC arranges Yoga classes for the students for their all round development. We are thinking of arranging Yoga classes once in a month. The thought of arranging psychological counselling for the students by expertise psychoanalyst is in the process.



Quality improvement in teaching learning process is made by constant monitoring through Academic Subcommittee and IQAC. We have already started Smart classes.

Final year exam is conducted by the university .Besides pre-final Test Exams, college takes Midterm Tests and Class Tests. Surprise tests are also taken. A full -fledged examination team has been constituted in this academic year to supervise over the Examinations (both College & University) to carry on the job smoothly. Besides this, IQAC through the Academic Sub-Committee keeps vigilance on this process. From this academic year we are going to introduce On-line Examination system.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Ours is an undergraduate institution so there is no scope for engaging students in research work but the faculty members try to coach the students of Honours departments in such a way so that they can be oriented towards research activities. We arrange students' Seminars to orient the students in thinking on their own. Some of our faculty members act as research guides. We have set up a Research Laboratory under BOOST in Collaboration with 'S.N.Bose Institute: Centre for Basic sciences". This year Two Day Workshop on **Nanotherapeutics** (10 &11 March 2017) was arranged by Zoology Department to orient the students towards research activities. In 20th December 2017 Botany Department arranged Students' Academic Fest (SAF) on **Plant Human relation** where students of the department made Poster Presentation on the theme.

Students of the Zoology Department participated in the "District Student –Youth Science Fair 2016" Organized by "Department of youth service, Government of West Bengal " on 22nd & 23nd December, 2016 and by acquiring 3nd position were selected for State Student youth Science fair 2016, At Netaji Indoor Stadium, Kolkata on 15th –17th February, 2017. The model was on "Agriculture-Environment & Energy conservation".

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

College Introduced Wi-Fi connection from the previous year. Open access system in the Library has been introduced from January 2014. In 2015-16 sessions we have introduced Security Control Machine (Century Eas Rx & Tx Dual Antena) in the Library. In this year (2017) we have installed Air-conditioned Machine in the Library.
