- 2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC
  - 1. **In order to enhance the quality of teaching and learning** IQAC has arranged the following things:
    - a) Like the previous years' this year also IQAC has directed the faculty members to arrange special classes (Remedial Coaching Classes) for the academically backward students. Special coaching classes have also been arranged by different Departments for the meritorious students. All these classes are arranged after Test Examination of the

students of each year. Seven smart classes have been introduced since the academic year 2016-17.

- b) In this academic session (2017-2018) also all the Departments, being directed by IQAC, have arranged meetings with the guardians of the students who have failed in their Pre-Final Part 1 Test Examination and as per their request supplementary examination was also held. Students, who were unable to secure 40% marks in supplementary test, are not sent up for their Final University Examination. And this decision has been taken along with the Teachers' Council, Students' Union and Guardian Forum. Not only that, this year we have also disallowed some students of the final year for their lack of required percentage.
- c) In this academic year IQAC has introduced **On-line Feedback System** for Students, Teachers, Guardians and Alumni.
- 2. In order to enhance Student Support Services IQAC has taken the following steps:
- a)Since few years back IQAC has introduced mass SMS to the students conveying information regarding all sorts of academic activities like examination, deposition of fees, admit card and mark sheet distribution, dates of academic and carrier counselling etc.
- b) We have made a MOU with **Excell Mediskill Private Ltd** and along with them IQAC has arranged short-term courses on i) Modern Office, ii) Computer Hardware, iii) Beautician course, and iv)A. C. Repairing.
- c) IQAC has given permission to INFINITY, a local Institution, to conduct Communicative English classes for the students and two short courses on this has been successfully organized. We will introduce another course this year.
- d) This year IQAC has given permission to **Consulting Learning and Development Private Limited** to organize some short courses on i) Small/ Back Office Coordinator and ii) Banking Associate.
- e) To cap it all, this year Government of West Bengal has chosen our College for establishing a centre for Skill Development under the scheme of "Swarojgar Yojona (WBSWA)" in collaboration with TATA STRIVE and BHARAT CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE. The project will start soon.
- 3. In order to enhance Health awareness as well as Social Commitment IQAC has started Thalasemia Screening Camp for the students since last 4 years. This year we have also organized camp on Thalasemia Screening Test. NSS has also organized health awareness camp with experienced doctors at Banibon Panchayet area, an adopted village of our College NSS.

- 4. This year the **Student Counseling Cell of IQAC has organized** a special seminar on Management of Examination Related Stress keeping in view the anxiety and tension regarding examination prevailing among most of the students. The renowned Psychologist, Dr. Anuttama Banerjee came to share her views with the students on 09.04.2018 and she talked on "**Management of Failure**". The talk was very much beneficial for the students and in the interactive session students actively participated in the seminar.
- 7. This year IQAC has arranged Tagore's Birth Anniversary programme in a rather elaborate way. Students as well as the Teachers participated in the programme and we enjoyed a colourful cultural function.

University of Calcutta has given permission and from the Academic Year 2018-19 Post Graduate (Regular) Course in Mathematics and Bengali will be starting and the admission process has already been started.

Quality improvement in teaching learning process is made by constant monitoring through Academic Subcommittee and IQAC. We have already started Smart classes.

Final year exam is conducted by the university .Besides pre-final Test Exams, college takes Midterm Tests and Class Tests. Surprise tests are also taken. A full -fledged examination team has been constituted from the academic year 2016-17 to supervise over the Examinations (both College & University) to carry on the job smoothly. Besides this, IQAC through the Academic Sub-Committee keeps vigilance on this process. Our thought of introducing On-Line Examination system is in pipe-line.

### 6.3.4 Research and Development

Ours is an undergraduate institution so there is no scope for engaging students in research work but the faculty members try to coach the students of Honours departments in such a way so that they can be oriented towards research activities:

- 1. We arrange students' Seminars to orient the students in thinking on their own.
- 2. This year Zoology Department organized **Outreach Programme for Exchange of New Innovation at the High School Level** by involving the students of Zoology Honours who went to Uluberia Binapani School to carry out the programme successfully.
- 3. A team of students comprising of Physics and Zoology Honours participated in West Bengal Science Fair, 2018, both at District and State level.
- 4. Some of our faculty members act as research guides.
- 5. We have set up a Research Laboratory under BOOST in Collaboration with 'S.N.Bose Institute: Centre for Basic sciences".

### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

College Introduced Wi-Fi connection from the previous year. Open access system in the Library has been introduced from January 2014. In 2015-16 sessions we have introduced Security Control Machine (Century Eas Rx & Tx Dual Antena) in the Library. From the year (2017) we have installed Air-conditioned Machine in the Library.

**Strength**: Due to the concerned involvement of the Governing Body President and the Head of the institution a positive environment has been created in the college which enables to inspire the students, their guardians and the teaching and non-teaching staff.

**Weakness:** We have to deal with a great number of students most of whom are coming from very poor financial background, hence in spite of our support (both financial and educational) almost 20% students drop out in every year.

**Opportunities:** The College authority has a look out to provide every possible academic environment to the students. The Campus is situated in the heart of the town and it is conveniently connected with two railway stations and National Highway.

**Threat**: We welcome the Choice Based Credit System which is to be introduced in all courses from the Academic Session 2018-19. But we are a little bit apprehensive of the increasing rate of drop out. We fear that many of our students (specially Boy students) could not maintain the required percentage for the new system as they have to work for their family and cannot attend the College regularly.
