15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The multidisciplinary or interdisciplinary approach to education is a paradigm that transcends the traditional boundaries of academic disciplines, fostering a holistic understanding of complex issues through the integration of diverse perspectives, methodologies, and subject areas. At its core, the multidisciplinary approach emphasizes collaboration and synergy among different fields of study. Rather than compartmentalizing knowledge into distinct disciplines, this approach encourages the exploration of connections and intersections between various domains. By bringing together insights from disciplines such as science, humanities, social sciences, and the arts, students gain a more comprehensive understanding of real-world phenomena and challenges.

Uluberia College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and thereby is bound to follow the syllabi and guidelines propounded by the university. In the academic session 2018-19 University of Calcutta introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) which revolves the path of learning towards multidisciplinary approach. For example, skill based courses are introduced in various disciplines; compulsory Environmental Studies, Bengali and English language courses are introduced to the students of all streams (Humanities, Science and Commerce). In the academic year 2023-24 the university introduced the Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF) system following the guidelines of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. This system is much more akin towards multidisciplinary approach of learning. Within the stipulated framework students can consider one Major discipline, one Minor discipline and one Interdisciplinary Course (IDC) along with Skill Development courses and language courses. This system also enables the students to experience internship in various specialised aspects of their chosen discipline thereby providing them with a practical learning environment. The CCF system is a progressive approach towards better learning by allowing the students to engage in cross-disciplinary dialogues, critical thinking and problem-solving and cultivating skills

essential for navigating today's complex global landscape. Furthermore, the CCF system promotes a more holistic view of education, where students learn to appreciate the interconnectedness of knowledge and its relevance to real-world issues. By bridging the gap between theory and practice, students develop a deeper appreciation for the value of their education and its potential impact on society.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system is a virtual storehouse that contains information of credits earned by individual students. It allows the students multiple entry and exit points in a particular course as well as enables them to move from one institution to another seamlessly keeping a track of their earned credits throughout their journey of learning. ABC id gives the students the chance to utilise the National Credit Transfer Framework (NCTF). Under the purview of NCTF the students can learn from various MOOCs made available online by the government like SWAYAM, NPTEL, NDL, Swayamprabha etc. and collect their credits in their assigned ABC id.

Uluberia College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta which has implemented the Academic Credit Bank system from the 2024-25 session. There will be a mandatory column in the registration form from this year to insert the ABC id. This is definitely a welcoming initiative made by the university keeping in mind the new CCF system which has been introduced from 2023-24 session following the NEP 2020. This will certainly provide the students a better opportunity to venture new avenues of learning and forge firmer grasp over skill based learning which is the need of the hour.

17.Skill development:

Skill development:

(NEP) 2020 of India advocates for a transformative shift towards skill-based education, aiming to equip learners with practical abilities essential for their holistic development and employability. This paradigm emphasizes the integration of vocational training with academic learning, fostering a dynamic educational ecosystem. NEP 2020 underscores the importance of early exposure to vocational skills, enabling students to explore diverse career pathways and make informed choices. By promoting experiential learning and apprenticeship, the policy seeks to bridge the gap

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between theoretical knowledge and real-world applications. Uluberia College follows the syllabi of University of Calcutta under CBCS and CCF system following NEP 2020.

- 1. As per the curriculum under CBCS and CCF system Skill Enhancement Courses are taught in various subjects.
- 2. The college's Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has suggested implementing Add-on courses across all departments, making them compulsory for every student in the college. The college offered thirty-two such courses which aim to provide the students with exposure beyond their regular curriculum. The selection of topics for these Add-on courses was carefully considered to ensure they offer knowledge that extends beyond what is typically covered in the curriculum.
- 3. The college has taken up additional initiatives to organize various skill development activities like Spoken Sanskrit Course, Communicative English Courses, Computer Concept Courses in collaboration with The Institute of Computer Engineers (India), Certificate courses in Advanced Excel Training in collaboration with Right Brains Technology etc.
- 4. To promote physical fitness and self-defence the college has introduced Yoga Classes in collaboration with SRI SRI RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME TRUST and Karate classes in collaboration with Traditional Shoto Karate Association of Bengal (TSKAB).
- 5. A hands-on training workshop for soap making has been conducted under the supervision of Dr. Shyamal Kumar Sarkar by the Department of Chemistry.
- 6. A three Months Certificate Course on "Mushroom Cultivation Practices" in collaboration with CCAE, Vidyasagar University, is carried out by the Department of Botany on particular intervals.
- 7. The college has introduced a certificate course on CPBFI (Certificate Programme in Banking, Finance and Insurance) in collaboration with Centum Learning Limited, a Training Partner of Bajaj Finserv Limited, to provide the students with best opportunities for career advancement and specific skill development.
- 8. To promote value education among the students and to nurture socially responsible citizens the college organizes social outreach activities. A collaborative cultural programme was organized where specially-abled children from a local special educational institute "ASHA BHABAN", participated alongside the students of our college. The students of our college went on an outreach programme at a local orphanage "CHIRONABIN" to socialize with the children out there thus ensuring

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- experiential social learning.
- 9. College Journal: Uluberia College releases a peer-reviewed journal titled QUEST, aiming to foster research acumen among both faculty members and students. Additionally, various departments contribute to the publication of wall magazines and e-magazines as part of their efforts to promote scholarly endeavours.
- 10. The Placement Cell of Uluberia College has enabled a Competitive Examination Portal for training the students for various competitive examinations in collaboration with Right Brains Technology.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The Indian Knowledge System (IKS) is a rich and diverse tapestry of intellectual traditions that has flourished over millennia, encompassing philosophy, science, arts, literature, and spirituality. Rooted in ancient texts like the Vedas, Upanishads, and epics, IKS embodies a holistic understanding of life, the universe, and existence itself. At the heart of IKS lies the concept of interconnectedness, where various branches of knowledge are viewed as interlinked and mutually reinforcing. This holistic perspective is evident in disciplines such as Ayurveda, Yoga, and Vastu Shastra, which emphasize harmony between the body, mind, and environment. NEP 2020 has recognised the relevance and value of IKS, and has integrated it within the modern education system. Its focus on learning in vernacular medium has reinforced the knowledge of local languages, art and culture to its optimum use. The faculties and students of Uluberia College are always prompt at learning and manifesting their indigenous language, culture and knowledge. The Bangla Bhasha and Sahitya department organizes seminars and academic programmes on 21st February every year to commemorate the International Mother Language Day. The department of Sanskrit has organised a Spoken Sanskrit Programme in collaboration with Sanskrit Bharti from 17th to 27th November 2022. The practice of Yoga and meditation is a regular custom among the students of Uluberia College.

Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

To ensure high academic standards across all areas, the institution maintains a focus on continuous quality enhancement through outcome-based education. Teaching and learning challenges are addressed through ongoing formative assessment and curriculum mapping. The curriculum is regularly updated by Calcutta University to stay

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abreast of evolving knowledge requirements and to fulfill specified learning objectives, ensuring that each student attains the intended goals upon completion of their education. The institute has established a structured mentor-mentee program where faculty members play various roles such as instructors, trainers, facilitators, or mentors, depending on the desired outcomes. Alumni seminars are conducted to share success stories with current students, inspiring them to concentrate on their studies by illustrating the potential outcomes of their chosen curriculum.

20.Distance education/online education:

Distant Education/ Online education:

Uluberia College offers Distance Education Postgraduate Courses under Vidyasagar University in Bengali, History, Sanskrit, English, Botany, Mathematics and Zoology since 2008. However, due to certain unavoidable circumstances Postgraduate courses in Botany, Mathematics and Zoology were discontinued. Bachelor of Library Science course was introduced in 2018. Under the affiliation of Netaji Subhas Open University Undergraduate Honours courses and Postgraduate courses in Bengali, English, Political Science and History were introduced. Postgraduate Course in Mathematics, MLIS and MSW courses also started in the year 2018. All the classes of distance education are resumed to offline mode once again postpandemic. The Distance Education facility of our college caters to a large section of students, who face difficulty in continuing their educational endeavours in regular mode, thereby, enabling a comprehensive learning environment.

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Uluberia College offers 18 Undergraduate Courses including B.A, B.Sc, and B.Com. along with 2 Post Graduate Programmes following the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as framed by the University of Calcutta (CU). Besides, the college runs a separate B.Ed section following CU curriculum. At the beginning of the academic year, IQAC in consultation with the college authority prepares an academic calendar following the academic calendar of the University. All the departments have an extensive, vigorous curriculum plan that is fruitfully delivered to the students.

The Routine Committee prepares a master routine maintaining the needs of different departments. The faculty members meticulously prepare tentative month-wise lesson plans which are shared with the students. Classes are taken in both conventional chalk and talk way and also through ICT-enabled classrooms as required. Regular field works and educational tours are conducted by different departments for the cognitive and psychomotor

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development of students. The college has developed an App named "Uluberia College" for effective curriculum delivery, submission of project work, user-friendly interface for staff attendance, class attendance, conduct of various Add-on courses etc.

In summary, the institution provides a holistic and inclusive learning environment for the overall development of the learners' personality.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Uluberia College caters to a massive number of students belonging to semi-urban and rural areas and most of them are first generation learners. Therefore, it is a primary focus of the institution to orient these students for the modus operandi of a higher educational institution and motivate them on the path of higher attainments.

The learning levels of the students are assessed on the basis of the students' class attendance, response, interaction, internal evaluation and participation in academic as well as non-academic activities. The teachers of the concerned departments identify the slow learners on the basis of their performance and try to motivate and assist them to cope up with the pace of the system within and outside the classroom. The teachers provide them with learning materials; suggest books from the library and also give special assistance to clear their doubts.

For the advanced learners class presentations are arranged which serve as a platform for the students both advanced and slow learners to involve in academic discourses. The advanced learners are also motivated to help their class-mates through group discussions and inclusive learning programmes. The institution encourages both the groups to participate in various activities organised by the college to ensure their holistic development.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Uluberia College is affiliated to The University of Calcutta; thus is bound to follow the university syllabus and module. The college improvises the curriculum to indulge the students in experiential and participative learning.

The disciplines that include practical hands on activities engage the students in experiential learning through laboratory experiments; utilization of low cost easily available tools for conducting the experiments; field works; preparation of field reports and presentations; hands on workshops etc.

In order to reinforce theoretical conceptions, real-world application and practice of acquired knowledge are emphasised. For example, students participate in workshops for cultivating mushrooms; they arrange "Campus Bazar" to sell commodities like hand-made soaps, seed pencils, decorative items made from waste materials all prepared by themselves.

Its functionality includes prior notification of class timings on daily basis; the automated registration of student attendance with a single button press, minimizing the time invested in elaborate attendance procedures. Similarly, faculty members can swiftly record their attendance as well. The access of class routine is just a click away for the beneficiaries. The app serves as a central hub for circulating notifications related to special classes, examination form-fill up dates, all the programmesorganised by various departments of the college, holidays, staff-meetings, class suspensions etc. Its utility extends to efficient documentation processes. Additionally, during examinations, the app facilitates the scanning of admit cards containing QR codes and automatic marking of candidates' attendance, streamlining the examination administration process.

Platforms like Zoom or Google Meet enable virtual classrooms, webinars, and online meetings and conferences.

To assess student progress, faculty members employ various methods such as class tests, surprise tests, and class presentations. Upon completing a module, teachers organize class tests either as impromptu in-class assessments or as online tests through the Learning Management System (LMS) portal. The graded answer scripts are shared with students, enabling them to comprehend their learning status and rectify any errors. Additionally, class presentations involve individual students or groups presenting on specific course topics, followed by a question-answer session facilitated by the teacher. This approach fosters open discussion and cultivates presentation skills, critical thinking, and the ability to articulate individual thoughts. The class test questions predominantly consist of multiple-choice or short-answer types, specifically designed to assess students' critical analytical abilities based on the content covered in class. With the introduction of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2018,

an internal assessment, constituting a mandatory internal test of 10 marks, has been integrated into the university's question pattern at the end of each semester, supplementing the traditional class tests. The 15 marks which is allotted for Tutorial Assessment, is utilized by the college as scope to make the students familiar with viva-voce tests. Certain departments also assess the students on the basis of their field and project work reports.

Mapping of program outcomes (POs) and course outcomes (COs) is a crucial process in educational institutions to ensure alignment between the overarching goals of a program and the specific learning outcomes of individual courses. This process involves matching each course outcome to one or more program outcomes using correlation parameters such as slight, moderate, or substantial correlation. For the matching we have used the correlation parameter: "1" - Slight (Low) Correlation "2" - Moderate (Medium) Correlation "3" - Substantial (High) Correlation "-" indicates there is no correlation.

Once mapping is complete, course outcomes are integrated into the curriculum, and assessment methods are developed to measure the attainment of these outcomes. Direct assessment, which constitutes 70% weightage from university exams and 30% from internal assessments, evaluates CO attainment. Indirect assessment, through graduate exit surveys and alumni feedback, is given equal weightage.

Calculation of the overall attainment level combines direct and indirect assessments. Gap analysis then identifies disparities between target and current attainment levels. If discrepancies exist, strategic actions are taken to bridge these gaps, refining the course and enhancing education quality. The synergy between PO-CO mapping and gap analysis enables institutions to achieve desired program outcomes. Implementing appropriate actions for each specific PO further prepares students for their future endeavours, ensuring the institution's continuous improvement.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college infrastructure pertains to 65 classrooms spread across 6 different blocks to accommodate students from 18 undergraduate, 2 postgraduate programs and a B. Ed section. There are certain rooms in the college which are equipped with fixed and portable projectors for interactive teaching methods. The college has 11 rooms with smart class facilities, a Learning Management System (LMS) and Language Lab for all teachers and students. The departments have adequate equipments and facilities for conducting experiments according to the curriculum. In addition some departments have specialised research laboratories, departmental libraries, medicinal garden and extensive collection of flora and fauna specimens. The college operates a Distance Learning Centre affiliated toNetaji Subhas Open University, where approximately 2000 students are enrolled in the program. During 2022-2023, the college undertook comprehensive initiatives to enhance its infrastructure , repair, renovation, and upgradation of sanitation and plumbing facilities .

The college's infrastructure includes and a Dedicated Transformer of 100 KV. The college also features a solar panel grid with a capacity of 25 kwp. The presence of 64 CCTV cameras inside the college campus contributes significantly to the overall safety and security measures of the college.

Amongst various initiatives taken by the institution in this regard, "Organic Compost Making from Kitchen Waste" has particularly drawn tremendous attention in the neighboring areas due to its simple yet effective means of producing organic compost in an unimaginably cheap route. The institute has not only started producing organic compost from canteen kitchen waste to meet its daily need for compost for the garden and plantation in the premises, it has also spread this practice in the adjacent areas through various awareness and handson training programme. Uluberia College is affiliated to The University of Calcutta; thus is bound to follow the university syllabus and module. The college improvises the curriculum to indulge the students in experiential and participative learning.

The disciplines that include practical hands on activities engage the students in experiential learning through laboratory experiments; utilization of low cost easily available tools for conducting the experiments; field works; preparation of field reports and presentations; hands on workshops etc.

In order to reinforce theoretical conceptions, real-world application and practice of acquired knowledge are emphasised. For example, students participate in workshops for cultivating mushrooms; they arrange "Campus Bazar" to sell commodities like hand-made soaps, seed pencils, decorative items made from waste materials all prepared by themselves.

Student seminars are organised in regular intervals in all the departments where the students present their understanding and ideas through innovative approaches like power-point presentations, group demonstrations, poster presentations, enactment of plays and many more. Since these activities require group performance hence participative learning is ensured.

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The departments also organise special classes where students of senior classes teach the students of junior classes under the supervision of the faculty members which reinforce their teaching skills.

The students also participate in the NCC and NSS extension programmes like clean campus drive, anti-tobacco campaign, plantation and adoption of plants in college campus etc. which make them aware of their social responsibilities and develop them as better human beings.

Its functionality includes prior notification of class timings on daily basis; the automated registration of student attendance with a single button press, minimizing the time invested in elaborate attendance procedures. Similarly, faculty members can swiftly record their attendance as well. The access of class routine is just a click away for the beneficiaries. The app serves as a central hub for circulating notifications related to special classes, examination form-fill up dates, all the programmesorganised by various departments of the college, holidays, staff-meetings, class suspensions etc. Its utility extends to efficient documentation processes. Additionally, during examinations, the app facilitates the scanning of admit cards containing QR codes and automatic marking of candidates' attendance, streamlining the examination administration process.

Platforms like Zoom or Google Meet enable virtual classrooms, webinars, and online meetings and conferences.

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To assess student progress, faculty members employ various methods such as class tests, surprise tests, and class presentations. Upon completing a module, teachers organize class tests either as impromptu in-class assessments or as online tests through the Learning Management System (LMS) portal. The graded answer scripts are shared with students, enabling them to comprehend their learning status and rectify any errors. Additionally, class presentations involve individual students or groups presenting on specific course topics, followed by a question-answer session facilitated by the teacher. This approach fosters open discussion and cultivates presentation skills, critical thinking, and the ability to articulate individual thoughts. The class test questions predominantly consist of multiple-choice or shortanswer types, specifically designed to assess students' critical analytical abilities based on the content covered in class. With the introduction of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2018, an internal assessment, constituting a mandatory internal test of 10 marks, has been integrated into the university's question pattern at the end of each semester, supplementing the traditional class tests. The 15 marks which is allotted for Tutorial Assessment, is utilized by the college as scope to make the students familiar with viva-voce tests. Certain departments also assess the students on the basis of their field and project work reports.

2.6.2 - Attainment of Programme outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the institution.

Mapping of program outcomes (POs) and course outcomes (COs) is a crucial process in educational institutions to ensure alignment between the overarching goals of a program and the specific learning outcomes of individual courses. This process involves matching each course outcome to one or more program outcomes using correlation parameters such as slight, moderate, or substantial correlation. For the matching we have used the correlation parameter: "1" - Slight (Low) Correlation "2" - Moderate (Medium) Correlation "3" - Substantial (High) Correlation "-" indicates there is no correlation.

Once mapping is complete, course outcomes are integrated into the curriculum, and assessment methods are developed to measure the attainment of these outcomes. Direct assessment, which constitutes 70% weightage from university exams and 30% from internal assessments, evaluates CO attainment. Indirect assessment, through graduate exit surveys and alumni feedback, is given equal weightage.

Calculation of the overall attainment level combines direct and indirect assessments. Gap analysis then identifies disparities

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between target and current attainment levels. If discrepancies exist, strategic actions are taken to bridge these gaps, refining the course and enhancing education quality. The synergy between PO-CO mapping and gap analysis enables institutions to achieve desired program outcomes. Implementing appropriate actions for each specific PO further prepares students for their future endeavours, ensuring the institution's continuous improvement.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college infrastructure pertains to 65 classrooms spread across 6 different blocks to accommodate students from 18 undergraduate, 2 postgraduate programs and a B. Ed section. There are certain rooms in the college which are equipped with fixed and portable projectors for interactive teaching methods. The college has 11 rooms with smart class facilities, a Learning Management System (LMS) and Language Lab for all teachers and students. The departments have adequate equipments and facilities for conducting experiments according to the curriculum. In addition some departments have specialised research laboratories, departmental libraries, medicinal garden and extensive collection of flora and fauna specimens.

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The college operates a Distance Learning Centre affiliated toNetaji Subhas Open University, where approximately 2000 students are enrolled in the program. During 2022-2023, the college undertook comprehensive initiatives to enhance its infrastructure ,repair, renovation, and upgradation of sanitation and plumbing facilities .

The college's infrastructure includes and a Dedicated Transformer of 100 KV. The college also features a solar panel grid with a capacity of 25 kwp. The presence of 64 CCTV cameras inside the college campus contributes significantly to the overall safety and security measures of the college.
